3. SELECTED PROGRAM UPDATES

Team Canada 2022 Program

Marty Deacon, High Performance Advisory Committee Chair, provided a Team Canada 2022 program athlete & coach services update:

- With the addition of a small number of reallocated athlete slots in Para Athletics the team size now set at 274 athletes (136 m, 138 w) and 134 staff, total 408.
- Weekly meetings occurring with Co-chefs Sam Effah and Claire Carver-Dias.
- Mission Team Leader Meetings now weekly until departure.
- Team Member Agreement finalized.
- Covid Relief support funding of \$498K from Sport Canada confirmed.
- An all stakeholder's "tabletop" security exercise was successfully conducted.
- Challenges update:
 - Athlete Villages: extra beds provided at CGB (University of Birmingham) so fewer required at CGC (Park Regis Hotel); Medical and Office space mostly sorted; Extra dining facility added
 - Opening Ceremonies; departures starting later; chairs to be provided in athlete staging area; early departure opportunity available

Claire Carver Dias, CSC Communications Committee Chair, provided a Team Canada 2022 program communications services update:

 CSC Communications Committee received Team Canada 2022 Communications Plan overview from Patrick Kenny, Team Canada 202 Communications Chief. Patrick and the entire Team Canada 2022 communications team are doing a "World Class" job, and



• CBC to broadcast 2022 CWGs, further details to come.

Brian McPherson, CSC CEO, noted other activities at the 2022 CWGs of interest and involvement by Canada:

- July 26, Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF) General Assembly.
- July 27, Commonwealth Sport Minister's Meeting. Minister Pascale St-Onge is scheduled to attend, will stay for Opening Ceremonies and meet & support athletes, departing on July 30.
- Inaugural Commonwealth Esports Championships will happen August 5 7 in Birmingham but are <u>not</u> part of the 2022 Commonwealth Games.
- Several CSC related individuals will attend the 2022 CWGs in non-CSC related roles, notably: Bruce Robertson, Linda Cuthbert, Nicole Forrester, Andrew Pipe and Frank Fowlie.
- CSC Partners Hospitality Program has representatives from PCL, Gowling Canada and Kukri
- Hamilton100 representatives will participate in the Games Observers Program
- Team Canada 2022 will be Carbon Neutral, buying offsets supporting the protection and expansion of Great Bear Forest, an important the carbon capture sink.
- Team Canada 2022 is the most equitable, inclusive and diverse Team Canada, with more women than men athletes, a record number of para athletes and many self-identified LGBTQ2S+ and Indigenous athletes.

2030 CWGs Bid Update

- Hamilton100 is finalizing the 2030 CWGs Hosting Proposal to submit to the Ontario and Federal Governments for review and approval / support
- Hamilton100 Bid appears at City of Hamilton General Issues Committee on July 4 in support of a revised MOU between the Bid Committee and the City.
- Calgary has also expressed interest in 2030, should the Hamilton 2030 CWGs Bid fail to get to the international bid stage.
- CGF to publish 2030 CWGs Bidding Process & timelines in January 2023.

CSC 2022 Annual General Meeting

- November 18 20, Hamilton
- No schedule yet, but will be looking at a Hamilton 2030 CWGs venue tour
- Elections will take place for Directors and Members-at-Large, Call for Nominations distributed in August (3 months before the AGM)

CGF Update

Bruce Robertson, CGF Vice-President, provided an overview of recent CGF activities, highlights included:

- Birmingham2022 is working flat out in details at the moment; all COVID measures have been relaxed; did well with inventory of most games supplies; shortage of games vehicles, booking games vehicles will be a challenge.
- Victoria2026 (AUS) is working through a long list of items for the Host City Agreement; currently 15 sports, could add another 4 or 5 sports.
